Kids bullied over food choices



174 pupils in England, Wales and Scotland were asked about their views on food. It turned out children were bullied for eating ‘un-cool’ school meals and some chose certain meals because they wanted to fit in.

“People at school tease me if I bring in my own healthy food instead of eating chips and pizza from the canteen. I’d rather eat my packed lunch which is healthy and tasty instead of the school’s junk.” **Kiara**, 15, Blackpool

“I probably have the healthiest packed lunch in my whole year at school, but I get teased so much about it, that I now want to have biscuits and crisps for break instead of fruit and crackers.” **Eleni**, 15, Berkshire

“I don’t think you can look cool by eating certain foods. Anyway, wouldn’t it be ‘cooler’ to stay healthy and in shape, instead of eating lots of junk food?”

Sarah, 16, Swindon

“Children do get bullied because of what they eat, I remember laughing at people that eat healthy food. We used to call a boy ‘chicken boy’ because he ate poultry every day.” **Tom**, 14, Worcester

“I don’t think children are bullied over what they eat. We have a salad bar at our school and no one gets bullied if they eat salad.” **Nikki**, 15, Coventry

“It’s ridiculous! At my school, everyone varies what they eat and nobody is fussed about anybody else. Bullying is certainly not caused by healthy eating, I think more the consumption of junk food. Too much is unhealthy and that’s what some people find uncool.” **Steff**, 16, Derr

MALE DIRTY TRICKS KEEPING GIRLS AWAY FROM BEACHES?

- 1 Californian police are investigating a number of nasty tricks played on women surfers who like riding the waves. Groups of male surfing fanatics claim these women surfers are ruining their fun on the beach.



- 2 Over the past year the number of American surfers has grown by a quarter and most of them are female. Even ten-year-old girls and 50-year-old grandmothers are learning 'to grip the board with their toes'. In 1996 10% of American surfers were women, now 500,000 of the 2.4 million surfers are women.
- 3 It's not surprising that men are getting nervous. "Surfing is the ultimate male sport," complained Sam George of *Surfer Magazine*. "Men like to look at women on the beach, but they don't want to see them in the water."

4 The problems on California's overcrowded beaches have risen sharply. Last month 18-year-old Shelley Brimmer started surfing for the first time in her life on Huntington Beach, south of Los Angeles. She was knocked off her board again and again by a pair of male surfers. "This was angry, territorial stuff," said Shelley. Her parents have reported the incident to the police.

5 *The Surfrider Foundation* has grown very concerned about the violence against female surfers. It paid for a number of internet-linked cameras to be installed to try and calm things down. Instead, the cameras were vandalised within weeks.

6 A Los Angeles lifeguard admitted that a lot of 'nasty' things happened last summer. "A handful of men lost their temper, urging each other to run young women surfers down and drive their boards on the rocks," he said.


7 But young female stars of the sport like the Australian Layne Beachley have got enough of this male attitude. Layne warns: "No man gets in my way, not unless he wants to drink a lot of salt water."



Harrow, 57, who has played with the New York Philharmonic Orchestra, said:


"There is so much talk about this city being impolite and full of thieves but this sure shows New York has heart."

Kids feasting on school dinners



- 1 Hungry pupils of Icknield High School in Luton are going wild for school dinners – after their headmaster hired a top chef. His name is David Lucas, he is 47 and father of two children. He was trained at the Savoy Hotel and was one of London's best cooks. After his wife had a heart attack he wanted a new job which would allow him to be at home in the evenings to look after the children.
- 2 He had to accept a big drop in salary but he said: "I can't think of a better way to use my talents than to help young people learn to love good, healthy food. Growing kids deserve the best. It's also more of a

challenge because a lot of children only want junk food".

- 3 Boiled cabbage is just a bad memory for kids thanks to top cook David Lucas. Youngsters now get meals like roast pheasant, Boeuf Bourguignon, Chicken Teriyaki, salmon fishcakes and seafood paella – all served with salads and vegetables for just £1.20 a day. David has a budget of just 40p per child for ingredients. But he can still turn out five-star meals because he buys quality food cheap from local markets.
- 4 It's no wonder that an extra 150 pupils have signed up for dinners since David took over. That's more than half of the total school population of 780 pupils. Even the teachers queue up and eat the school dinners David Lucas and his team have prepared. They agree that the school canteen beats many restaurants in the area.


